Once I return from Moose International you will start getting information on our September Annual Convention which I'm sure will be wonderful as we return to the Nugget.



SECRETARY MESSAGE

For those of you who don't know we honor all new Pilgrims at a dinner on June 4th back in Illinois and present them with their Pilgrim lapel pin. The Association also provides them with their Pilgrim pocket badge worn with their Pilgrim jacket.

What an exciting year we had with our membership growing enough for us to move up in the ranks of Associations in membership to second place. The quarterly billing occurred on May 19th. You probably noticed that it was higher than the previous billings this Association year. This is because it is based on the April 30, 2022, membership figures, which means it now includes all members of your Lodge. With our increase in membership comes an increase in your quarterly billing cost which is calculated as \$1 per quarter. Just a friendly reminder that you can pay your Association dues online which is the easiest way to send your dues payment. Remember that the system is secure and does not retain the credit/debit card information in the system, so your information is protected. Note the lock when the website is accessed. You can find the link for paying your Association dues on your favorite part of our Association website (www.ca-nvmoose.org) > Secretary > CNMA Forms > Association Dues Payment.

As another reminder any Lodge that qualifies for the California Nevada Moose Association 5 Star Award will receive a \$1 per member credit (based on the <u>4/30/21</u> membership) and that credit will be reflected on the August 15th billing. Our apologies that our Lodges have not been provided with a status of their qualification, but hopefully that will be accomplished soon.

We have completed the transition of the website. Several changes have been made to enhance the website and there are more to come. The new and improved website is secure (notice the lock in front of the URL). If you have any suggestions, please send an email to <u>caassoc15@gmail.com</u>. Now is a good time to offer constructive feedback on what you would like to see offered on our website. You should notice that the website now displays better with a smart phone & IPAD as a result of the upgrade.

We proved we were "Stronger Together" as the Moose Fraternity finished on the plus side for the first time in a long time at +5,120 members. "Make it Happen" is the new campaign for the 2022-2023 year.

We also had a very good year as an Association by finishing with an increase of over 4,000 members in California & Nevada. Along with this our Moose Charities giving exceeded \$310,000 while also assisting to fulfill three projects thus far to include the Mooseheart Activity Center (MAC), Mooseheart Lunchroom PODS, and the Moosehaven Bingo System including a big screen TV.

Please review the new Premier Lodge and Leadership Awards requirements, as of now every Lodge has an opportunity to earn the Premier Lodge award. The focus areas need to be on retention and enrollments/orientations. These two things go hand in hand because it allows new members to learn about the fraternal side of our organization and allows existing members to become rejuvenated by hearing about what we continue to do as a Moose Fraternity.

If you need assistance with performing orientations/enrollments, please reach out to your Territory Manager. Please also appoint a membership chairperson who will put a team together to work Lodge retention, we continue to sign up new members, but our overall retention rate is below the goal of 80%.

New officers also need to take Lodge Leadership training online or register for a class when one becomes available. You have until June 30th, 2022 to take the training and also be a member of a respective higher degree such as the Moose Legion or Chapter.

Finally, I hope to see many of you at the International Moose Convention in Orlando, FL or in September at the Annual Association Convention in Sparks, NV. Let's **Make it Happen** and have a wonderful year.

What a great way to end the old year and to start the new fiscal year. Membership within the Moose Fraternity went above and beyond, with membership being the best since 2012. What a great accomplishment.

California Nevada Moose Association (CNMA) ended the fiscal year with 52,402 members, and an increase in membership of 4,507. The membership committee met their goal and we are happy about these numbers. We had 78 Lodges that increased their membership totals for the year by at least one member. Congratulations to each of you. Now let's keep it going.

The CNMA new membership incentive started on May 1, 2022 and will continue through September 30, 2022. If you sponsor 3 new members in this timeframe, you will receive a blackout Flat Magnetic LED Flashlight, making it perfect for a nightstand or even in a lady's purse, making it handy for her safety at night. Sponsor 5 new members and you will receive a 22 oz aluminum sports water bottle with carabiner, making it easy to carry if you're biking or hiking, but it's great for anytime you need to carry water. We think all of you will like both items. So, get out there and sponsor some new members for your Lodges.

Membership is the core of our Moose Fraternity, and maintaining your membership numbers will actually save your Lodges money on the amount they are required to pay the Association, so let's make a difference this fiscal year and retain our current members in addition to sponsoring new members. There are so many things a Lodge can do to retain their members, but none bigger than your Lodges hosting events that draw your members to your Lodge. New Member Orientation



Hello,

As the New Member Orientation Chairman it is my responsibility to provide you all with guidance on conducting orientations at your lodge homes.

First of all it is one of the criteria for earning the Premier Lodge Award that each lodge should be striving to earn. If a lodge does not earn the Premier Lodge Award then the Lodge President and Administrator are not eligible to

earn the Leadership Award. See the attached guidelines on both awards.

Why are New Member Orientations Important?

If you think about orientations in a lodge and for our fraternity, they're an important part of welcoming new members. For example, when done properly they provide information on our private policy, Mooseheart & Moosehaven, membership incentives offered at both the Moose International level all the way down to our local lodges. Generally, new member orientation is crucial for membership-based organizations because it:

- Encourages new members to get involved by showing them pathways for engagement such as volunteering
- Acts as an ice breaker for members to meet fellow members (even if they are just other new members)
- Serves as the first step in retaining a member at renewal time by introducing them to member only benefits & the member benefits offered exclusively to Moose Members through our Member Benefits Program
 - A Moose membership card provides access to over 1,600 Lodges across North America, but it also offers much, much more. Did you know that your Moose membership provides you with benefits that allow you to save more than your membership dues? That's right, just being a member of the Moose Fraternity provides you with a variety of money saving opportunities in categories like Travel, Entertainment, Insurance, and Health & Wellness. Your Moose membership has it's benefits – Don't forget to take advantage of all that the Moose has to offer!
 - Go to <u>www.mooseintl.org/member-benefits</u> to learn more about all the exciting benefits offered exclusively to moose members.
- Helps new members become familiar with policies
- Ensures they understand about other options such as the Moose Legion and Women of the Moose and earning the degrees of The Moose.

2022-2023 Premier Lodge Award

Beginning May 1, 2022 through April 30, 2023, in order to earn the Premier Lodge Award a Lodge must:

1) Increase Active Membership over the fiscal year ending 4/30/2022



 Increase in Total Giving to Moose Charities, excluding amounts for Safe Surfin' over the fiscal year ending 4/30/2022. Includes Youth Awareness and individual Donor Circle donations to Moose Charities for your members.

OR

Lodge per capita contributions to Moose Charities during the fiscal year ending 4/30/2023 must equal or exceed the fraternity-wide per capita average of \$6.51 per member (as established during the prior 2 calendar years)

- 3) Submit Heart of the Community Reports and receive a grade of "Good" or better on each report
- 4) Indebtedness on the monthly Moose International Consolidated Billing Statement is less at April 30, 2023 than the balance due shown on the May of 2022 statement (any April 30, 2023 balance of zero or less is considered less than the prior year)
- 5) Submission of Moose of the Year nomination form by established deadline
- 6) Lodge must be represented at the 2022 International Convention
- 7) Lodge must remit Endowment Fund contributions to Moose Charities in at least 10 months during the year
- 9) Lodge must hold an Orientation/Lodge enrollment a minimum of every two months during the year.

Leadership Awards

When the Lodge qualifies for the Premier Lodge Award, both the President <u>and/or</u> Administrator can earn a Leadership Award, qualifying each of them for 100,000 Moose Rewards points. In order to qualify, the following criteria must be met individually:

- Must serve a full term from May 1 through the following April 30th
- Must be an active Chapter/Moose Legion member at the close of their term, April 30th
- Must sponsor at least three members into The Moose during term of office
- Must, during their term of office, have personally attended <u>all</u> meetings below during their year of service (Alternate Delegates qualify for a Lodge's representation but does **NOT** qualify for the Leadership Award)
 - o Association Annual Convention AND Association Mid-Year Conference
 - o 2022 Moose International Convention
- Must have successfully completed the minimum required training, pursuant to the Training rules and regulations.

Without exception, <u>ALL</u> of the above conditions <u>MUST</u> be met in order to qualify for the award.

***At the discretion of the Chief Compliance Officer, a Lodge may be disqualified from earning the Premier Lodge Award or Leadership Award for failing to abide by our General Laws.



TRAINING NEWS



Hopefully you are closely monitoring the California Nevada Moose Association (CNMA) website CNMA Education (formally known as Fraternal Education) section to see any posted training opportunities scheduled.

Unfortunately the Two **Section** Hands on Technical Training (**2 HOTT**) has been postponed again until the end of June. The course is now called a "**2 Section**" versus a "**2 Day**" because the course has been redesigned as a basic course with two sections, one being LCL Web and the other being QuickBooks Online (**QBO**). It is also now a one-day session. There are a few things that aren't addressed in this basic session (i.e., the Export feature)

that will be offered in an Advanced course that will be available sometime in the future. We will also be offering virtual sessions for our more seasoned users of **QBO** and LCL Web.

Several of your Moose Technical Trainers have received updates on how training will be conducted, and it is significantly different than what we are accustomed to. Until we get better acclimated to this new way of training, be prepared to schedule to attend a session when it is offered in person in your area as these in person hands on classes may be limited. Attending a class virtually is the new and improved way to get your training requirements completed, however it is recommended that you attend an in-person session if you have not previously worked with QuickBooks or the "Moose" way of bookkeeping. For those of you who are more comfortable with attending a session online please plan to attend one of the scheduled virtual sessions to ensure you get the credit you need. It is important to remember that Chapter Treasurers and Lodge Administrators are required to attend a 2 HOTT for either personal honors or as a requirement of their position.

If you have been installed in an Officer or Chairman position in your lodge then Lodge Leadership training is for you! In the case of officers, it is mandatory and must be completed within 60 days of taking office! Good news is that Lodge Leadership training can be taken online and is highly suggested for <u>all</u> members of The Moose. It can be found on the Moose International website > Members Area > Moose Training > Moose Online Training > Online Training – Credit Eligible > Lodge Leadership. Don't forget to take the Lodge Leadership Assessment Test and remember you need a score of 80% or better to receive credit. Also note that you receive Moose Rewards points for taking online training. The most convenient way to do that is online which is available 24 hours a day and 7 days a week.

Coordination of training sessions is important to ensure we handle the demand, and it is the responsibility of the Training Coordinator (yes that is me!) to do that for this Association.

WOTM Training sessions for 2022 – 2023 are scheduled and have been published on the CNMA website under CNMA Education. Additional sessions will be scheduled in the coming months so visit this section of the website often to find out about in-person classes near you. There are also a virtual session scheduled if you prefer to take the training from the comfort of your home.

As always, all your California Nevada Moose Association (**CNMA**) trainers (Technical, MLEC, Lodge Leadership & Administrator School) are here to assist you in any way they can or to provide some one-on-one assistance.

Have you taken advantage of the procedures that are available on the **CNMA** website under the **LCL-QBO Procedures** section? These procedures have been developed to help all fraternal units with day-to-day operations and tasks. If there is something that you would like to see added or updated, please contact me using the information provided below.


Veterans have seen and experienced challenges and opportunities that most Americans have not. But it is that very perspective that is the source of their unique value.

Brainstorm and think out-of-the-box; there is something for everyone **PLAV** (Polish Legion of American Veterans), **JWV** (Jewish War Veterans), **TREA** (The Retired Enlisted Association), **Sub Vets** (Submarines), Women Veterans, **VVA** (Vietnam Veterans); Cooties,

Louse, Sad Sacks, Devil Dogs and still more. They could become your most loyal cooperative group.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) provides a discount of up to \$30 per month that can be used toward broadband service for eligible households, and 20 leading internet providers will offer ACP-eligible households a high-speed internet plan for no more than \$30 per month.

LOSS PREVENTION MESSAGE

Loss Prevention -- Summer is here -- Some things you should know about <u>Heat Exhaustion</u> The following article is courtesy of Lockton Affinity:

Heat exhaustion is one of three heat-related syndromes, with cramps being the mildest and heatstroke being the most severe. While heat exhaustion is in the middle, this syndrome must be taken seriously.

Heat Exhaustion Causes:

According to the Mayo Clinic, your body needs to maintain a normal core temperature around 98.6F. In hot weather your body cools itself by sweating. However, when you overexert in hot, humid weather your body cannot cool itself efficiently.

This syndrome can also be caused by dehydration, alcohol use, and overdressing. Certain factors can increase your sensitivity to heat including:

- Young or old age Infants and children younger than four and adults older than 65 are at a higher risk of heat exhaustion
- Certain medication Some medications affect your body's ability to stay hydrated and respond appropriately to heat. These can include high blood pressure and allergy medications.
- **Obesity** Carrying excess weight can affect your body's ability to regulate the temperature and cause your body to retain more heat
- **High Heat Index** When the humidity is high, your sweat can't evaporate as easily and your body has more difficulty cooling itself, making you prone to heat exhaustion and heatstroke

Heat Exhaustion Symptoms

Symptoms or heat exhaustion may develop suddenly or over time and can include:

- Cool, moist skin with goose bumps when in the heat
- Heavy sweating
- Faintness
- Dizziness
- Fatigue
- Low blood pressure upon standing
- Muscle cramps
- Nausea
- Headache

If you think you are experiencing heat exhaustion, stop all activity, rest and drink cool water. Untreated, heat exhaustion can lead to heatstroke, a life-threatening condition that requires immediate medical attention to prevent permanent damage to your brain and other vital organs.

How to Prevent Members from Experiencing Heat Exhaustion

When hosting an outdoor event on a warm day, consider these tips:

- Check for weather updates
- Watch your local news for extreme heat alerts. Consider moving events indoors or rescheduling if temperatures reach extreme levels.
- Schedule outdoor activities carefully. Try to plan events in the morning or evening. If your event is in the afternoon, provide plenty of shaded areas and water.
- Encourage loose-fitting, lightweight and light-colored clothing
- Provide plenty of fluids. Sports drinks can replace salt and minerals that have been lost in sweat. Avoid alcoholic beverages, which can dehydrate members more.

Schedule breaks. Encourage members to start slowly and pick up the pace gradually. Set regular breaks in a cool area or in the shade.

With these considerations, your Lodge can host a successful, safe outdoor event during the summer months.
