

It is that time of year when members of this Association consider applying for a position on the Executive Committee, becoming a Committee Chairman or Sergeant-at-Arms, or perhaps an Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms or Committee member. The deadline of July 15th looms and a member might wonder what form do I use to apply for one of these positions? Here are the answers (<u>each item that is highlighted and underlined is a clickable link to the applicable form</u>):

All forms can be found on the <u>CNMA Website</u> on the <u>Secretary</u> page. Once you complete the form DO NOT FILL IT OUT AGAIN – One application per year. The <u>Association</u> year is defined as October 1 to September 30 and is a selection at the top of the form.

Anyone wishing to be considered for a position on the CNMA Executive Committee should fill out the <u>Executive Committee Application</u>. The Executive Committee is defined as President, Vice President, Junior Past President, Chaplain, Treasurer, and Secretary.

Anyone wishing to be considered for a **Committee Chairman** position or as the **Sergeant-at-Arms** (*not Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms*) should fill out the <u>CNMA Chairman Application</u>

Anyone appointed by the Chairman to be a committee member <u>must</u> fill out the <u>Committee Member</u> Information Sheet.

Anyone appointed by the Sergeant-at-Arms to be an Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms <u>must</u> fill out the Committee Member Information Sheet.

After elections are held for District Officers the following forms are to be completed:

The elected District President <u>must</u> fill out the <u>District President Application Form</u>. The due date is July 15th. The District Secretary <u>must</u> complete the <u>District Officers Information Sheet</u>. This must be completed immediately following the District elections.

Questions can be directed to the respective assigned representative as defined by the CNMA Policy Manual Policy 8.2.

As promised another quarterly Association dues billing occurred on May 15th. Many lodges have already made payment and we appreciate it. We would like to thank everyone who has taken advantage of paying their Association dues invoice by clicking the "Review and Pay" button in the email sent on May 15th to each lodge Smartermail account. If your lodge did not receive this email (or accidentally deleted it) please let us know and we will reissue it. As a reminder the 5 Star Award credits will not be applied to eligible lodge accounts until August and prior to the August 15th quarterly billing. The Executive Committee must complete a final review of the results and consider any appeals that may be received.


As always, there will be things to work on and areas we can improve such as retention and the sponsorship of new members. As an Association, we did not










Membership Committee Chairman - Robert Leon

May and June at Mooseheart are very busy for the students and staff as they begin to wind down the year and gear up for promotions, graduations and summer vacations.

The first week in May brought balmy weather, a Cinco De Mayo celebration, and the Reserve Officers Training Corps (RORC) Annual Awards Ceremony. Dignitaries from the Great Lakes Naval Base were present to observe the students and present awards. Warrant Officer Rick Smith conducted his last inspection at Mooseheart as he is retiring at the end of the year. May 7th was the 46th Annual Mooseheart Relays at Mooseheart Stadium. The Northeastern



Lodge Leadership Training sessions are being scheduled to assist all lodge members with learning about the general laws of The Moose. Understanding the roles of the officers, chairmen, committee members and members is vital to lodges earning awards such as the Premier Lodge Award, California Nevada Moose Association (CNMA) Five Star Award and Leadership Awards. This training is required for all lodge officers and is good for three years. Those members who are taking the training for the first time are suggested to take it in the classroom. Those renewing can take it online using the Moose International website > Members Area > Moose Training > Moose Online Training > Online Training — Credit Eligible > Lodge Leadership. There are two modules and a Lodge Leadership Assessment Test. A

score of 80% or better must be achieved in order to receive credit for completing the training. Many sessions are being scheduled throughout our Association so please check the CNMA Website > <a href="CNMA Website

Administrator School and 2 Section Hands on Technical Training (2 HOTT) sessions have been scheduled throughout our Association. If you are an Administrator, Chapter Treasurer or Moose Legion Secretary it is required that you attend this updated training. There is no online training for this training. Review the appropriate general laws to ensure you have the right information to remain current in this important training as the requirements are different for each position and for a Chapter Treasurer who is working toward the Star degree it is required.

Remember that all training sessions can be found on the CNMA Website > <u>CNMA Education</u>. Our website is a valuable resource for this Association and should be reviewed at least weekly to ensure that you are up to date on the latest news.

Now that our prior fiscal year has ended as of April 30th it is now 990 tax time for our fraternal units – and 199 tax time for California units. Please file your 990, and 199 by the required due date of **September 15th**. Do not wait till the last minute especially if you need assistance. Not filing can be very costly as interest and penalties accrue **daily**. Go to the CNMA website, > LCL/QBO Procedures > Tax Procedures to find instructions and clickable links to the appropriate form. Not sure what to do? Call Moose Technical Trainer Deborah Story – she is happy to assist! Call her at 310-704-7669 or email ladyfelix17@gmail.com. She has already sent an email (and a letter via snail mail) to all units letting us know she is here to help. As an added bonus, with QuickBooks Online there is a way to add her as an Accountant so she can access your database and prepare your taxes electronically!

Chapters and Moose Legions can electronically file the Internal Revenue Service Form 990N and the Franchise Tax Board required CA199N. A listing of all units assigned numbers can be found in the same location CNMA website > LCL/QBO Procedures > Tax Procedures > Lodge IRS/FTB FEIN/ Corp ID Listing. entity ID numbers for all chapters is also on the Your greatest resource is Deborah Story! Don't wait till the last minute, contact her today!

The Story Continues

Hello to all - The Story Continues,

At the International Convention of the Loyal Order of Moose in Detroit in 1911 Director General James J. Davis instructed the Supreme Council to look for property which, could be obtained for the establishment of a 'Moose College' Institute, or 'School.' When it became generally known that the Moose planned to build a school, offers of property came from all parts of the country. For an entire week in December 1911, a joint committee of trustees of the Supreme Council met at the Willard Hotel in

Washington to receive and examine the offers. During these meetings and a number of subsequent ones, it was decided that the school should be located somewhere near the center of population. This ruled out many possible sites. Finally, in December 1912, it was decided to purchase a dairy farm known as Brookline Farm, near Aurora IL and several hundred acres from an adjoining farm. The land was acquired in January 1913, and consisted of approximately 1,000 acres of fertile farmland in the scenic Fox River Valley.

The Name Mooseheart was suggested by Congressman John J. Lentz of Ohio who served on the original Mooseheart Board of Governors. The name was formally adopted at a meeting in Chicago in February 1913. The Story Continues.



Can you imagine opening **The MOOSE** Conventions & Conferences first, by the posting of the Colors by two California Nevada Moose Association (**CNMA**) District Color Guard units and three Lodge Color Guard units with all those colorful and **patriotic flags** waving in the movement? Or attending a community parade and watching several **patriotic entries** representing their Moose Lodges? You could be walking next, to that entry, handing out small personal American flags to happy smiling children on the parade route, along with a candy or healthy snack. Several Lodges have organized and used the program to conduct creative **Patriotic Programs** that motivates their member families and invites communities to come participate in a flag waving program that 'celebrates America' and instils pride in participants. Conversely, some Lodges are satisfied to have an internal program like a dinner for members to celebrate the anniversary of each military branch of service. Each organization at every level is free to decide to do as much or as little as the members wish to do, in order to accomplish as much or as little as they desire.



Patriotic Programs at every level; from an internal dinner to a local community program to a major public reunion, or ceremonial program or parade - and the price is right! There is no reason **ANY Lodge** cannot develop and sponsor their own **Patriotic Programs**, as a mechanism to support their membership. We have the potential to guide '**Valued Veterans**' to do wonderful things for our Lodge, District, Chapter, Moose Legion, Community and Association.



We are not all the same and we should just accept the fact that there are differences between our Lodges and their membership: size, interests, activities, community engagement, fraternalism, resistance to change, etc. Remember that it is our desire to assist any Lodge that **WANTS** help; and certainly not to compel one that prefers its 'privacy.' Individuals, groups and Lodges who have questions or who would like more information; please reach out and we will get you connected.

There are always issues as well as opportunities. And for those of us who choose to see 'THE GLASS-IS-HALF-FULL' - we recognize that most major problems also, simultaneously, provide 'an opportunity to excel.' For those who see the glass is 'HALF-EMPTY' look for the positive resources in your Lodge - EVERY Lodge has a couple, who merely need a true opportunity to 'do something.' But first every Lodge should discuss to decide - do we want more than we now have? Remember that we have the resources and experience to help those who WANT help. We appreciate that true 'leadership' does not COMPEL anything; it merely assists an organization to do those things that the 'organization' wants. < AmVetNet@yahoo.com >

Our **CNMA Valued Veterans Program** includes truly resolute '**Patriots**,' committed members who sincerely desire to support and advance **patriotism** for a multitude of reasons. Those of us who have experience with these **Patriot Volunteers** know that they are sometimes even more dedicated than some Veterans themselves. Sometimes in honor of their father or grandfather, or merely because they have never been offered an opportunity 'to serve.' There are a couple in every Lodge to find, ask, and support them!

For some programs and initiatives there is the consideration for financial support for: flags, decorations, printing, advertising, gifts, souvenirs, prizes, etc. That is where **SPONSORS** can help us make things possible **NOW**, instead of later after timely fundraising.

SPONSORS: There are commercial sponsors that have expressed interest in providing some support for our programs; but they **NEED** to know our statistics: How many Veterans do we have?

WW II, Korea, Vietnam, Women, Cold War, Submarine Service, Ex-POWs, Legion of Valor, etc. Please, we have created forms and rosters to assist Lodges to more easily list, record and categorize their Veterans and essential uniqueness; please ask if you **WANT** help. Remember that these sponsors can provide the resources we need to grow, support, and expand what we need to grow and prosper. We have grand ideas and initiatives that we would like to implement, but everything needs financial support. For example: A Color Guard needs flags and uniforms, visiting hospitalized Veterans needs individual flags, military branch decals, pins, or patches:



- Lodge identify and list ALL your Veterans > Decide when you will meet monthly, determine
 your interests, priorities, organization, and leadership > Select & schedule the programs you
 want > Assign a committee to manage each program > Reach out, invite, coordinate, and
 cooperate with neighboring Lodges.
- We desire to identify and to honor our Veterans, from the oldest to the youngest; but we NEED that information from YOUR Lodge every Lodge [PLEASE]. We cannot schedule the medal program for WW II and the Korean War Veterans until we know WHO and HOW MANY there are! And it is estimated that 273 WW II Veterans die every day. PLEASE help!

Every two years the Congressional Budget Office gives a 10-year overview, just before the start of the new Congressional session. The report includes both required and optional budget and program recommendations for programs, services and benefits to military and Veterans. Decisions which are made upon these recommendations directly affect Veterans, their spouses, dependents, survivors, and caregivers from changes in compensation as well as by reductions of programs and services. A few of the proposals currently under consideration are:

- 1. A financial means test for **VA** disability compensation for Veterans with higher incomes.
- 2. Elimination of the VA 'Individual Unemployability' compensation to disabled Veterans when they reach Social Security 'Full Retirement Age' (FRA0 3) benefit reduction for Veterans older than 'FRA' and
- **3.** Reducing costs by limiting eligibility for the lower disability ratings. And do not forget that certain interests are pushing budget savings by reducing and limiting eligibility for burial at Arlington National Cemetery.

CONGRESS: This is the season when Congress prepares new Veteran's initiatives which will be supported in the next National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA FY 2024); and this is a short window of opportunity when they give little attention. Inside and outside interests will ask (push) our elected officials to support or create programs which will affect Veterans, military, and their dependents. This period is when Congress is most receptive to ideas and opinions from the Veterans' community. Our official Veterans organizations are always pushing for Veteran support; and that is **WHY** it is important for every Veteran to be an official member of at least **ONE** Veteran's organization.

Remember that Congress controls the 'purse strings,' and therefore, what the **VA** is both directed and financially supported to do. For example, we have reported on the 2022 Veterans **PACT ACT**; and Congress will monitor claims applications to determine whether to expand and support the program. Recall also that Congress scrapped the **VA** Asset & Infrastructure Review last year when they rejected the plan to close several of their medical facilities. Now you should know that they are being pressed to severely restrict eligibility standards to qualify for burial at **Arlington National Cemetery**.

On a more positive side, **VA** has recently opened enrollment for the Veterans Affairs Life Insurance (**VALife**); which allows Veterans aged eighty (80) or under and with **ANY** level of service connected disability (0%-100%) to apply at any time with no medical exams or health questions necessary.

Veterans eighty-one (81) or older may apply for **VALife** within two years of receiving notification of a new service-connected disability and under certain conditions. **VALife** is available in \$10,000 increments up to \$40,000; does accrue cash value but does not extend to dependents. For more detail go to https://benefits.va.gov/valife.asp.

<u>Veteran National Parks Pass</u>: The Interagency Military Pass covers entry fees and is available online at https://store.usgs.gov/MilitaryPass and a \$10 processing fee. Save the fee cost by applying in person at your convenient location identified at https://www.nps.gov/planyourvisit/pickup-pass-locations.htm.

FINAL PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS: We are working on a comprehensive package to assist our members in addressing key issues and making decisions regarding their personal decisions,



wishes and preferences for any circumstance when they cannot articulate their wishes. We are called-upon several times a year to assist bereaved families to apply and coordinate final benefits and services for their incapacitated Veteran relatives. The most critical issue is the Veteran **MUST** inform the family **WHERE** they keep their military service documents, especially the 'DD-214'; the 'key' to all **VA** benefits and services. We are printing a convenient form to assist the Veteran and centralize documents when he or she is incapacitated.

Health professionals from counselors to psychologists advise Veterans to 'TELL YOUR STORY' as personal self-help therapy for several of their concerns, issues, and problems. We now have the personal 'MY MILITARY LIFE' journals for all veterans. Once you start, it is tough to stop; Just ASK!

Begin creating **YOUR** input to **OUR Valued-Veterans** & **Patriots Programs** list: Parades, Color Guards, Memorial Honor Squads, and Community Parade Units.


