





Looking forward to seeing you all in Costa Mesa in March!!



Training Coordinator – Cheryl D Volden

Training News



As this newsletter goes to press our final 2 Section Hands on Technical Training (2 HOTT), Virtual Moose Legion Educational Conference (MLEC) and Administrator School sessions will be held for this calendar year. We want to thank the California Nevada Moose Association trainers for their dedication to scheduling and presenting all the training needed by our Association members. Next time you see one of them be sure to thank them.

We were successful in deploying online registration for all our scheduled sessions. Have you ever given any thought to the need to let the instructors know your intent to attend a training session? It is important for us to know how many folks will be

attending so we can ensure that there are enough training materials available for each attendee. Remember that it costs the Association to produce or purchase these materials. In the case of some classes, we need to know your experience level to determine the number of additional instructors that might be needed to assist the students with hands on exercises. With the implementation of virtual sessions multiple trainers are needed to support the Adobe Connect software, they need to not only instruct the class but have a facilitator to run the session and breakout rooms. *Please be courteous and thoughtful to your dedicated training team and register as soon as possible.* Remember also that paying when registering guarantees your spot in the session. Sometimes there are so many people who need to attend as a condition of their position and they we may have to give priority to them if they have prepaid for the session.

Individuals who wish to attend a scheduled session will need to click the link provided on the CNMA website under CNMA Education and register online for the class they want to attend. It will also take your payment for the session (*always required prior to being confirmed for any training session*) using your debit or credit card. We are working on a solution for accepting electronic payments using a checking account (this would be for a Moose Legion, Chapter or Lodge in lieu of writing & remitting a check). Once again we ask for your patience and understanding as we navigate these new tools.

As a friendly reminder Administrators are once again **REQUIRED** to attend a basic **2 HOTT** session in order to register to attend an Administrator School so the technical training staff has been scheduling them the day before an Administrator School so this requirement can be met. Unfortunately, the Virtual 2 HOTT is not yet available so keep this in mind when the Virtual Administrator School becomes available in January 2024. A January 2 HOTT session has been scheduled for January 21st at the Ventura Moose Lodge so if you need it please be sure and register as soon as possible to attend.

As always, all your **CNMA** trainers (Technical, MLEC, Lodge Leadership & Administrator School) are here to assist you in any way they can or to provide some one-on-one assistance.

Have you taken advantage of the procedures that are available on the **CNMA** website under the **LCL-QBO Procedures** selection of the **CNMA** website? CNMA Moosehaven 'AAA' Project News



Hi ALL, Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all of YOU and YOURS.

Thanks to all of you who have and continue to participate in the **Moosehaven AAA Project** it is holding its own. As of October 31, 2023, the Contribution total has reached \$88,757.14, which means we only have to come up with \$111,242.86 to reach our minimum Goal of \$200,000.00.

So let us take a look at things we need to adjust in order to achieve our past history of looking back at our minimum Goal. The California Nevada Moose

Association units are made up of Lodges, Districts, Chapters, Moose Legion jurisdictions, and Councils of Higher Degrees. As of 10-1-2023 of the 108 Lodges, 79 (72.5%) are participating; of the 19 Districts, 12 (62.3%) are participating; of the 5 Council of Higher Degree units, 3 (60%) are participating. Participation is defined as having donated some amount. Donations range for contributing Lodges between \$50 and \$8,725; Districts \$20 and \$1321; COHDs \$45 and \$500. So, with the aforementioned in mind, we would appreciate those in leadership positions of each program area to please take a look at the nonparticipating units in your area and help us help them in resolving whatever issues are found. If our Committee can be of any assistance in helping with an issue toward resolution, please contact us.

We have another group of Donors who deserve our recognition, and they are the individual donors who currently number 54 and that have collectively, since the beginning of the **Moosehaven AAA Project** have to date donated in amounts ranging from \$10 and up, a combined donation total of \$17,976.72. On behalf of our Committee and the Moosehaven Residents we say **THANK YOU THANK YOU!!**

Robert F. Havlike, a young engineer, was employed to oversee construction and some elements of vocational training. William Stephens, a Pennsylvania Farmer, was put in charge of the farm and was asked to put in an orchard. An Aurora physician was engaged on a part time basis to care for the health of the children.

Mooseheart began to grow rapidly. A complete water and sewer system was installed in the spring of 1914. A deep well was installed, and a water tank was erected. A carload of elm trees was purchased and spread out on the bare campus, which today

is tree-lined and shaded.

Work began at Purity Hall, a girls dormitory, and soon after it was completed, work began on Loyalty Hall a boys Dormitory.

A well-versed Ritual has a meaningful impact on the Candidates.

VISIBILITY: Personally, being at a Conferral where other Pilgrim, Fellowship, & Moose Legionnaire Brothers are in attendance is a joyful remarkable sight. Attendance is not always possible, but an amazing sight to see, especially for the Candidates. This is one of the keys to ensuring that at the forefront of Retention we are visible and ready to begin **MENTORING** the next generations of Higher Degrees and Quota-busters! How wonderful to ensure and know that the Legacy of the Moose Legion will be well cared for, for future generations. Be a part of that!

RETENTION: Are we actively holding on to our expiring Moose Legionnaires, are we calling them to see how they are doing first, then ask about their dues? Is there a financial, health, or any other issue as to why they are not renewing? For every Moose Legionnaire we lose, we need to sign two to keep up with our Membership numbers. Let us all be a part of the solution, rather than the problem. . .

Recognize and honor your Veteran of the Month and ▶post a 'mini-**BIO** in your newsletter! ▶We have so many Veterans with unique experiences, history witness, humor and then Submarine Service, Glider, Pilots, Reconnaissance, **ETC**. ▶Create your Veterans Wall/Corner, Fotos **THEN & NOW** and provide Veteran benefits materials for Veterans **AND** their families. Many Veterans think they know '**ALL-ABOUT THE VA**;' but it is only when a spouse learns about missed benefits, that they encourage the application • Solicit & post **BEFORE & AFTER** pictures, ribbons & awards.

▶ Let us know how we can help you to do all the things that your members can dream of doing. We have information, resources, experience, history, and ideas to assist you.

► A reminder > UNCLAIMED MONEY FOR VETERANS:

VA still holds much Unclaimed Money - much is government insurance policy payouts or dividend checks and premium refunds mailed to policyholders and that delivery failed for a multitude of situations. When payments cannot be delivered they are returned to the Department of Veterans Affairs where they are

held indefinitely by the **VA** Insurance Division. **IF** you or a family member has any unclaimed money, you can check at the **VA** website.

(https://insurance,va.gov/liability/ufsearch.htm)

Note: When searching common names, you may need to provide more specific details such as middle initial/name, service number, **VA** file/insurance number, **ETC**. Many of these details are available on military service documents, often recorded and filed at county courthouses. Remember that these official records can be permanently saved by being recorded at your county recorder's office at no charge; and are available whenever a Veteran or dependent has a need.

By the way - did you ever notice that when you put the two words 'THE' and 'IRS' together - that they spell 'HEIRS'? Coincidence??

VETERAN SUICIDE NEWS YES, the rate of Veteran suicide is down from 22 to 17 **EVERY DAY**; but that is still outrageous! Post the **NEW 3- DIGIT SUICIDE NUMBER - #988** is the new National Suicide Crisis number and Veterans need only to **press #1**. Please keep these numbers handy and available for those who want to seek help. Post the number prominently. Veteran suicide should be a national outrage **- WE** can and should be a part of the solution!



There is a new program demonstrating significant success in suicide prevention. We will study and report here on this new nonprofit organization —'Save-a-Warrior.' More to come. ▶ Even though PTSD treatments work, most people who have PTSD do not seek out treatment. **BE-A-FRIEND**, Reach - Out and honestly help a buddy! We can all help. Text a Veteran, tonight. Just Check in. And download PTSD Coach or PTSD Family Coach apps and hear from Veterans who have turned their lives around with PTSD treatments. A vet is not likely to share casually or with a stranger.



'WHEN YOU'RE DOWN' 'When those thoughts come up of someone in your life that you care about, make it a priority to act, not to do it later, but to say, **OK**, I'm going to stop right now and just do that (Reach-Out).'

No deadline and no expiration. **BUT – DO** remember: to avoid a quick response/**DENIAL**, to **ALWAYS** seek the assistance of an 'Accredited' Veterans Service Officer who has experience with intricacies of these types of **VA** claims!
