


If it were easy, everyone would do it, but you are not everyone; YOU are SOMEONE!



New Member Orientation



Happy New Year Moose Family,

We have three months left until the completion of the Moose year. This means you should have held at least 4 New Member Orientations to this point. These are critical for the members and the Lodges overall. All Lodges should be striving to earn the Premier Lodge Award, and Presidents and Administrators to earn the Leadership Award. These awards are a great honor for each Lodge. These awards are a goal we hope to achieve each year. Without the New Member Orientations this is not possible.

Who is responsible for organizing and running these meetings? The Lodge Membership Chair is officially tasked with organizing and running the orientation session; however, any officer or member can do the work as long as they are organized, articulate and personable. Remember that this session is often a new member's first impression of the Lodge, so put your best presenter front and center. I would also recommend possibly looking at organizing a team to share the workload. This can allow the presenters to get a break and present things they feel much more comfortable with. For example, I am not familiar with the chair positions within the chapter. I have a team member that collaborates with me on the New Member Orientation, and she presents with me. By doing it this way she communicates the information much clearer than I can regarding the Chapter, and I can discuss the Moose Legion.

Doing the presentation as a team has advantages other than just having more knowledge on a specific topic. It also breaks up the presentation for the presenters as well as the attendees. By changing the voice or the flow of the presentation you can keep the attention of the new members more easily. Presenters, share stories of your experiences as a member, which also helps keep the new members engaged and it allows them to hear about different perspectives of the Lodge.

At the California Nevada Moose Association 2024 Mid-Year Conference in Costa Mesa March 22nd to the 24th, we will have a New Membership Orientation booth. We will be sharing a PowerPoint presentation that the Rancho Cordova Lodge #2357 presents. Please stop by and ask any questions you may have about New Member Orientation.

At the end of the month the students who accumulated the most points win prizes. The points are then used to get them time in the MAC Center.

The Seniors will be busy in February planning Valentine's Day activities, and they are hosting a special Valentine's fundraiser at the school. They are also in the final planning stages of the senior trip. This year in April the seniors will be visiting the Wisconsin Lodges and Chapters for their community service activities. 42% of the Mooseheart students are expected to have completed their mandatory 25 hours of community service by the end of February. Each student is required to meet this goal annually. By the end of February everyone at Mooseheart will be eagerly awaiting the onset of warmer weather so they can get back outside for their sports and activities.



Training News



We have started work on a virtual version of the 2 HOTT and the dedicated team working on that training is excited about being able to offer it in a virtual environment using Adobe Connect. There are still some adjustments that will need to be made in the software so we do not have a date of when that will be available, and we will keep you posted on our progress.

We also have a dedicated team working on an Advanced 2 HOTT session for those individuals who have already attended a Basic 2 HOTT and want or need to have a more advanced session for a variety of reasons.

In the California Nevada Moose Association, we are excited to offer both classroom and virtual sessions. On April 26 we will offer a 2 HOTT session in the middle of our state in Bakersfield, CA at the Stockdale Lodge. On April 27th and 28th we will offer an in classroom session in the same location. So, if you need both sessions you can get them both accomplished with a single visit to exciting Bakersfield CA home of the Stockdale Moose Lodge 2178.

We need all students to understand how *important* it is for you to register online and pay upon registering so that we can adequately plan for the training sessions. Your dedicated instructors spend many hours preparing for a session; having assistants join them to ensure that they have adequate coverage for the number of students who have registered; and ordering materials based on registrations which is costly. If you cannot attend it is very important to let the instructor know. Sometimes we have such a need that we have to create a waiting list. We cannot let someone know that they can attend if we do not get notified that an existing registered student has changed their minds. With the virtual sessions this is even more critical because we cannot allow more than 20 students due to restrictions in the software. Recently I not only emailed each student a week prior to the session but called four days before the session. I had a waitlist and wanted to get those students in the session if at all possible. Having received no response, I called each student. One stated that they were on vacation! Two others did not respond but called the morning of the class to let me know that they did not have the link to the class (one called 1 hour and 15 minutes after the class had started). Being a virtual session, the one student was turned away because 1 hour and 15 minutes into the class it was too late for her to get credit. Bottom line is that there were waitlisted students who missed out because the registered students did not answer the email or make a call. So please be kind to our instructors and remember to keep them informed and pay when registering.

Always remember that your dedicated training team is here to help whenever needed. We are all just a call or email away! Check the CNMA Education page often to see what is being offered or to find contact information. Thanks for all you do!



Loss Prevention Note

My Brothers and Sisters of The Moose,

I suppose introductions are first in order. My name is Sam Hoffman and I have accepted the position of Loss Prevention Chair for the California Nevada Moose Association (CNMA). You might ask why?

The majority of my life has been about loss prevention. As a firefighter/paramedic in the San Francisco Bay Area, I have pretty much seen all that can happen, to a person, a business, a city/community.

Loss of life and/or property are things that do not heal overnight, and the effects can last for years. Whether it is a member dying or suffering a serious injury or the devastation or damage to a Lodge.

So, it was with this in mind that I asked to be a CNMA Chair. I had the pleasure, prior to my appointment, of addressing the membership at our Annual Convention and Mid-Year Conference this past year. Currently, I am a committee member of one. Or am I? Safety in our Lodges is the responsibility of each one of us. Did you notice a slip hazard and not report it? Did you let your friend that had a little too much to drink in the Social Quarters drive themselves home? When was the last time your Lodge did a ;walk around at your facility to inspect the condition of the grounds, equipment, furniture? This job cannot be done by itself. I hope that every Lodge has a Loss Prevention or Safety Committee. You should! There are great resources available from Moose International. The Continuous Accident Prevention (CAP) booklet and Lodge Safety Report Edition which is a guide to filling out your Lodge Safety Report. All Lodges are required to submit this report to Moose International electronically using LCL Web no later than May 31st. The form is available on the Moose International website.

In November Moose International issued a newsletter that contained a great deal of information. Each of us should take the time to review it. It can be found on the <u>Moose International website > Forms & Documents > Lodge Operations > Loss Prevention Resources. This document has lots of clickable link to other valuable documents including Hall Rental Coverage and Avoiding Claims and Lawsuits. There is also a Frequently Asked Questions page!</u>

Finally, I am always here to help. If members would like to join the Loss Prevention Committee, please let me know. Until next time. See you at the Moose.

The new California building was dedicated in 1959, and the new Ontario building in 1961. In celebrating the golden anniversary of Mooseheart, the fieldhouse was dedicated on the opening day of the 75th International Convention in 1963. The Health Center, provided by the Women of the Moose, was dedicated at the International Convention in 1974, and the first Floor of the old hospital was converted into a

girl's hobby shop. In 1984 the Herb Heilman Fitness Center was dedicated in honor of the Past Director General. In 1988, at the 100th International Convention in Chicago ,IL the California Nevada Moose Association announced the financing of a new archives and supply building to be located Adjacent to the Supreme Lodge. 
