

Reminders (cont'd)


- Quarterly Billing of Association Dues

 - August 15th 4th Billing \$1 per member on Lodge rolls 4/30/26
 - 5 Star Credit is applied on August 1st (credit \$1 per member on Lodge rolls 4/30/25)


Reminders (cont'd)

General Laws 51.5 (Already posted)

- Unless authorized by the Chief Compliance Officer, all Lodges shall be a member of the association duly organized and existing in the state, territory, or province in which each Lodge is located. To be in good standing with the association, each Lodge shall remain current in all financial obligations due to Moose International and the association or have entered a satisfactory payment arrangement with Moose International or the association to satisfy the outstanding indebtedness.
 - The Association Compliance Review Committee has established criteria, and it is published in the CNMA Policy Manual, Policy 10.0
 - Consequences identified in Policy 11.0
 - Sanctions identified in Policy 12.0

General Laws 51.5 (cont'd)

- Each Lodge <u>shall</u> be represented at all association conventions, conferences, district meetings, workshops, training seminars and schools as required by the association, Moose International or the Moose International Board of Directors. Each association shall adopt a policy, approved by the Chief Compliance Officer, to enforce the intent of this section.
 - Published in the CNMA Policy Manual which is available on the Association website at <u>www.ca-nvmoose.org</u> > Secretary > CNMA Policies/Guidance

What is a delegate? (Already posted)

- As provided in the CNMA Bylaws, Article VI Delegates, Section 1
 - Each good standing lodge in the Association shall be entitled to be represented in the meetings of the Association by two delegates who should be the President and Administrator or duly elected Alternate Representatives
 - Plus, one (1) additional delegate for each fifty (50) members on the rolls, or majority fraction thereof
 - No lodge shall be entitled to a representation exceeding twenty (20) delegates, nor cast more than twenty (20) votes
 - In addition to voting "delegates", each lodge may have non-voting members in attendance
 - Delegates shall consist of Past Presidents/Past Governors and Past Regents (who earned their title prior to May 1, 2021) who are in good standing with their lodge

- As provided in the CNMA Bylaws, Article VI Delegates, Section 2
 - Each delegate elected to represent their lodge at a meeting of the Association <u>shall</u> have their name submitted to the Association Secretary two (2) weeks prior to convention. <u>This certificate must be signed by the President and attested to by the Administrator under the seal of the lodge</u>. Each delegate present for a vote of the Association shall be entitled to one vote, providing the total number of votes does not exceed the number entitled the lodge, based upon the dues which have been assessed by the Association, and subject to the limitations contained in Section 1 of this Article.
 - A delegate may only vote for the Lodge with which they are registered.

- Section 3 All Past Presidents of the Association, and all members of the Board of
 Officers of the Association who are members of lodges in good standing within the
 Association, shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a delegate, and shall not be
 counted as part of the lodge entitlement referred to in Section 1 and 2 of this article
- Section 4 Any Duly Authorized Representative from Moose International appointed to serve the Association shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of a delegate, provided they hold membership in a Lodge in active status in the Association, and a shall not be counted as part of the lodge entitlement referred to in Section 1 and 2 of this article

- It is important that you identify **Alternates** using the proper process
 - CNMA website > Secretary > Alternate Delegate Guidance
 - The Guidance includes a Sample Delegate Letter
 - Must be sealed with Lodge Seal
 - Should be uploaded with online convention registration which is the preferred method
 - Must be provided **2 Weeks** prior to the Convention or Conference

- Most Associations require lodges to submit a list of their delegates we only ask for Alternates!
- Must be provided <u>2 Weeks</u> before the Convention or Conference
- No more delegate letters accepted on site!
- Since we do not vote at a Mid-Year Conference alternate delegate letters are NOT required.

What is the difference??

- A convention is where delegates are assigned to vote on Association Business
- Our Annual Convention is in September here in Reno, NV
- A conference is where we are supposed to educate our members and have FUN!
- Our Mid-Year Conference is in March in Costa Mesa CA
