#### **New Fraternal Recognition Program**

There are four achievement levels: Preferred, Power, Prestige, and Platinum.

Time is flying by, and it is already October. I just returned from Sparks, Nevada where I attended a very successful Annual Convention. As we end our year, Mooseheart has just begun their 2025-2026 school year. The students are all back on campus and started off on 8/13 with the annual Ice Cream Social sponsored by Mooseheart Chapter 3001. The

kids really enjoy this event because they get to reconnect with all their fellow students and catch up on their summer activities. Two students were privileged to attend the Yosemite Youth Conservation Camp. Eleventh grader Krista Pointek was newly chosen to attend and spent an entire month on site. Jeannie Briceno, who spent a month there last year, was invited back by the camp leaders to serve as a youth leader. Jeannie spent the entire summer at the camp and returned to Mooseheart just in time for the start of school.



## YOUTH AWARENESS NEWS

Greetings,

What an amazing convention in Sparks!!! Dina and the entire Executive Committee did a great job. We had a lot of **FUN** in our meeting. Roddy Myers wins for the best dance entrance. Our Official Visitor, Brian Toseki, was fabulous! I really enjoyed getting to know him and his wife Pam. Denielle Baile was wonderful! All the Chairs gave such great information. If you didn't make it, you missed a great weekend!

Our committee would like to thank everyone who came by our booth for information and to give a donation. Many of you gave checks to our committee in the check march. Thank you all so much!!! Your donations will help pay for our students to get to the International Youth Awareness (YA) Congress to compete for scholarships. It also helps us purchase the \$50 gift cards that the students earn for completing their Kids Talk reports and our \$500 finalist prizes that are awarded to each student when they return from the International Congress.

The following information was provided during my presentation and will be issued in CNMA Youth Awareness Guidance in the coming months.

A Lodge can host a Youth Awareness Congress, which should be reported on the Lodge Heart of the Community Report. Congresses must be held between July and October. The lodge is asked to provide water, sodas and depending on the time of day the congress is held, a light meal or snacks. That's it!

The students must attend a YA Congress in order to participate in the program each year. Each student should be sponsored by a Lodge, Chapter, Moose Legion or Moose Riders Activity Group. The cost to sponsor a student is \$35. The sponsor can donate a dollar amount (i.e., \$300), or they can sponsor a certain number of students (3 students at \$35 each, \$105). Any amount will be gladly accepted.

Our committee will provide \$50 gift cards to each student who completes their reports of their Kids Talks and \$500 for each finalist when they return from the International YA Congress. The flights to the International YA Congress are funded by the California Nevada Moose Association.

Individuals can donate funds or \$50 Visa Cards to support the program.

All checks must be made payable to California Nevada Moose Association, earmarked Youth Awareness.



The Convention was itself historic, being that this was our first female CNMA President, and our first father-daughter CNMA Presidency, since Joseph Gurrieri was President in 1996/1997. The Convention was incredible and well attended with over 5600 in attendance. While we made history, we also discussed history. Our Convention Official Visitor Brian Toseki is a wealth of historical knowledge from which I intend to draw a great deal of information. We

exchanged contact information and a lot of CNMA history and intend to do much more in days ahead. Our incoming President Bill Jackson has asked me to remain as Chair of this committee, and I graciously agreed. There is much work to be done!

My goal going forward is to gather Moose history from every one of our Lodges, and I need your help. I can help you discover your Lodge's important dates and even many events, but I reach out to you now to ask you to provide my committee with some information unique to your Lodge that probably isn't very well known. I would like to showcase our Lodges in upcoming newsletters and in our conferences and conventions.

#### Founding and Early Years

- 1888: Dr. John Henry Wilson and a group of friends founded the Loyal Order of Moose in Louisville, Kentucky.
- Initial Purpose: It began as a social club for men to gather and support one another.
- Expansion: Lodges were soon established in cities like Cincinnati, St. Louis, and various towns in Indiana.

#### **Expansion and Community Services**

- Mooseheart: In the early 20th century, the organization shifted focus and became a "dynamo of men and women" to build Mooseheart Child City & School, a 1,000-acre campus west of Chicago that provides a home and education for children and teens in need.
- Moosehaven: The organization also established Moosehaven, a 70-acre retirement community near Jacksonville, Florida, for its senior members.
- Women of the Moose: The Women of the Moose (WOTM) was formally organized in 1931, with Katherine Smith serving as its first Grand Chancellor and guiding its growth for many years.

The Moose Lodge, or the Loyal Order of Moose, was founded in 1888 by Dr. John Henry Wilson in Louisville, Kentucky, initially as a men's social club, guided by the principle "A burden heavy to one is borne lightly by many". The organization later expanded to include women, with the formation of the Women of the Moose (WOTM). The Moose is a fraternal and service organization known for its community service, support of Mooseheart Child City & School for children in need, and the Moosehaven retirement community for seniors.

#### Mission and Principles

- Core Principle: The organization is guided by the motto, "A burden heavy to one
  is borne lightly by many," emphasizing mutual support and community
  service.
- Community Focus: In addition to Mooseheart and Moosehaven, local Lodges contribute significant community service through volunteer work, monetary donations, and programs for families.

#### Structure

- The basic unit is a Lodge.
- The Moose Legion is a higher degree of membership, focused on service and fun activities within the fraternity.
- Chapters: are the local units of the Women of the Moose.
